Our Constitution

CONSTITUTION

- I. The name of the organization shall be: **“THE FSX CLUB OF WASHINGTON, D.C.”**
- II. The primary purpose of the organization shall be:
 - a. To maintain the ideals, principles and objectives upon which the Forest Service was founded and by which it has been governed.
 - b. To serve as an agency, through which previously active members of the Forest Service can continue to share with each other, the ties of friendship, common purpose, mutual achievement and interest – experience which characterized their active years as a member of the Forest Service.
- III. Membership in this organization shall be available to those persons who were in the employment of the Forest Service but are not now regularly employed by the Federal Government, and if engaged in full-time non-Federal employment have reached the age of sixty.
- IV. The Officers of the organization shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer who shall, ex officio, be members of the Executive Committee, in addition to which, there shall be elected two others to serve as members of the Executive Committee. As thus constituted, the said Executive Committee, under the direction of the President of the Club, shall conduct and manage the activities of the Club in conformance with the constitution, as herein set forth or as hereafter amended. Any four members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum. The duties of the Secretary shall be to keep the books and records of the Club and to handle correspondence as directed by the President. The duties of the Treasurer shall be to receive and disburse funds subject to the direction of the President.

V. Election of officers shall be held biennially. Sixty days prior to election, a nominating committee, designated by the President shall recommend a "Slate" to be voted on by members of the Club. Nominations can be made for any office from the "Floor". An ad interim vacancy in an elective position shall be filled for the remainder of the term by majority vote of the Executive Committee

VI. The Club shall hold six regular meetings each year - in January, March, May, July, September and November. Other meetings may be held at the call of the President or upon request of four or more members of the Executive Committee.

VII. There shall be no regular yearly dues, but should the Treasury become depleted, members in attendance at any given meeting will be assessed a small amount, not to exceed one dollar, to maintain solvency.

VIII. To amend this constitution, the Executive Committee shall present proposed change(s) by electronic mail in advance of a regular meeting and, after discussion; they shall be adopted or rejected at this same meeting by majority vote of the members present.
